ABSTRACT

This file provides a template for writing papers for the national conference. The conference proceedings will be published in an electronic format. The full paper file shall be written in compliance with these instructions. The author is asked to submit the paper in MS-Word and PDF Portable Document Format (PDF). Both files shall be saved with the full first author name as name of the file.

An abstract not exceeding 500 words, in English, should appear on the top of the first page, after the title of the paper in chapter titled "Abstract" (without chapter number), after the names of the authors and the contact information of the corresponding author.

Key Words: Maximum 4 Key words.

1. INTRODUCTION

It is expected that authors will submit carefully written and proofread material. Spelling and grammatical errors, as well as language usage problems, are not acceptable in the final submission for publishing the proceeding. There is no strict limitation to the number of pages, but it is suggested that the paper length should not exceed **6000 words**.

2. Full Paper format

Papers should contain **introduction** as described in section 1, **the Body (Objective, methodology and discussion of findings), conclusions and list of references**. Papers are to be prepared in **English (British or American)**. Technical terms should be explained. Acronyms should be written out at their first appearance.

3. SUBMITTING THE Paper

The Full paper has to be submitted electronically by e-mail to the following addresses: **Email 1: desalegnalem@gmail.com** and **Email-2: marzasias@yahoo.com** . And it should be submitted by 15 January 2017.

4. PAPER FORMAT

The uniform outlook will help the reader to follow the proceedings. This can be obtained most easily if authors use this template file to construct their papers. Please note the following details: this template is an A4 format. All text paragraphs should be single spaced, with first line intended by 10 mm (0.4 inch). Double spacing should only be used before and after headings and subheadings. Position and style of headings and subheadings should follow this example. No spaces should be placed between paragraphs. Please do not change any of the above mentioned page, paragraph and font settings.

4.1. Fonts

Papers should use 11-point Arial font. The styles available are bold, italic and underlined. It is recommended that text in figures is not smaller than 10-point font size.

4.2. Tables and Figures

Figure captions and table headings should be sufficient to explain the figure or table without needing to refer to the text. Figures and tables not cited in the text should not be presented. Styles Heading Table and Caption Figure are available in this template for tables and figures. The following is the example for Table 1.

Tables and figures should be placed close after their first reference in the text. All figures and tables should be numbered with Arabic numerals. Table headings should be above the tables. Figure captions should be centred below the figures. Minimum figures' resolution: 150dpi.

5. REFERENCES

You should number your references sequentially throughout the text, and each reference should be individually numbered and enclosed in square brackets (e.g. [1]).

Please ensure that all references in the Reference list are cited in the text and vice versa. Failure to do so may cause delays in the production of your article.

Please also ensure that you provide as much information as possible to allow the reader to locate the article concerned. This is particularly important for articles appearing in conferences, workshops and books that may not appear in journal databases.

Please provide all author name(s) and initials, title of the paper, date published, title of the journal or book, volume number, editors (if any), and finally the page range. For books and conferences, the town of publication and publisher (in parentheses) should also be given.

If the number of authors on a reference is greater than three please list the first three authors followed by *et al.*
